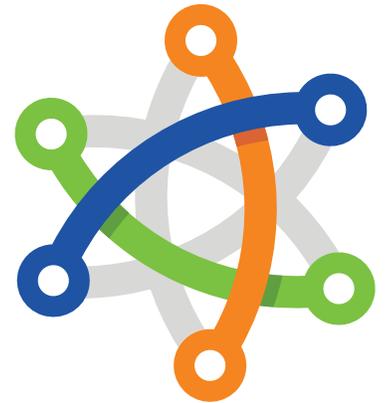

ConnectED Resources

Private-sector companies have committed more than \$2 billion to deliver cutting-edge technologies to classrooms, including:

Adobe

Free software for teachers and students, including Photoshop and Premiere Elements for creative projects; Presenter and Captivate to amplify e-Learning; EchoSign for school workflow; and a range of teacher training resources.

Apple

Donating a comprehensive hardware/software package (iPads, MacBooks, and other products), along with content and professional development tools to enrich learning in low-income U.S. schools.

AT&T

Free cellular wireless service for 50,000 students in low-income schools on their educational devices for three years.

Autodesk

“Design the Future” program is available to every secondary school in the country. The program offers free 3D design software (Autodesk Education Master Suite and Autodesk Entertainment Suite Ultimate), project-based curricula, training, and certification.

Coursera

The online education platform is partnering with top universities and offering free Verified Certificates for district-approved professional development courses to all U.S. teachers.

edX

Provide more than a dozen free online teacher professional development courses from leading universities, as well as free ID Verified Certificates to all teachers for one year and all teachers in high-need schools for five years. All students will have free access to online Advanced Placement-level courses and students in high-need schools around the country will also be able to earn free verified certificates for these courses.

Esri

Free ArcGIS Online Organization accounts – the same Geographic Information Systems mapping technology used by government and business – to every K-12 school in America, which will allow students to map and analyze data.

Microsoft

Launched a substantial affordability program open to all U.S. public schools by deeply discounting the price of its Windows operating system, which will decrease the price of Windows-based devices. Also providing free IT Academy grants to 2,000 low-income schools, whose students will be able to attain valuable IT credentials.

O'Reilly Media/Safari Books Online

Safari for Schools offers free online access for all US students to every single book and video course O'Reilly Media has ever published. This free content can spark and support an interest in technology, learning to code, and a range of STEM careers.

Prezi

Free Edu Pro licenses (presentation software) to high schools all across America. This will allow students to access a platform to create memorable presentations.

Sprint

Providing free wireless service for up to 50,000 low-income high school students for four years.

Verizon

A suite of programs administered by the Verizon Foundation that provide devices, mobile access to the internet for students, and teacher professional development.
